We envision a community of empowered women, girls and families succeeding through increased opportunities to pursue and fulfill their individual aspirations.

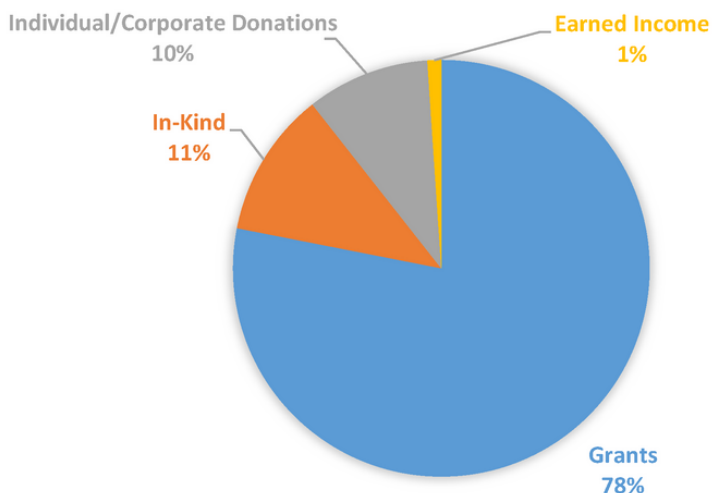
VALUES

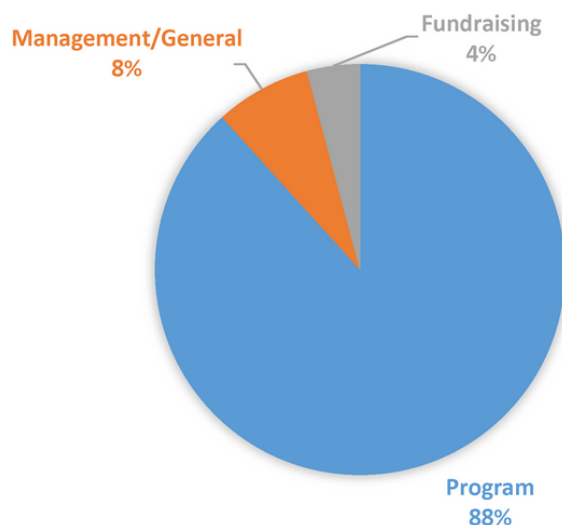
